










Cool Beans Brew Coffee Truck




















Positivity + Staff/Students Goes Hand in Hand!


December Artist of the Month - Harley Bode

December Middle School Service Club News



NLES STEM Spotlight



Elementary students have begun a new unit in STEM- Computer Science. We introduced the unit by discussing important internet safety tips, like how to be a super digital citizen and types of information to share or keep private. Now, all students are learning about coding and practicing their programming skills with unplugged activities and grade-level courses on Code.org. Fifth and Sixth graders even had a chance to program their friends to complete a task like a robot! In the first week of December, all students participated in the week-long

Hour of Code event hosted worldwide by Code.org.

During our Computer Science unit, students will also use online programs like Scratch to create and code fun programs, as well as, program robots like Ozobots, Dash, Sphero, Indi to complete tasks. Older students will use littleBits kits and other robots to design and program games. Students are working on a holiday project that involves electric circuits or binary code. Later this year, they will utilize the large green screen in the STEM rooms and learn about stop-motion and other animation apps. We are excited to build students' knowledge of computer science and coding and, hopefully, grow their passion for these skills!




