

# Ground Breaking Ceremony for New Elementary School Held October 1st!

On Friday, October 1st, after months of study, planning and discussion we were thrilled to break ground on the spot where the new Northern Lebanon Elementary School will stand! When completed, this new elementary school will bring together all Kindergarten through fifth graders previously housed at our four separate elementary buildings with the addition of sixth grade.

This new space will be over 189,000 square feet, hold up to 1,275 students and even have room for 24 buses. Students attending the new Northern Lebanon Elementary School in the fall of 2023 will have access to two large group collaboration spaces, a full-sized gymnasium and a 6,000 square foot media center.

On site for the ground breaking were current elementary students outfitted in hard hats and of course, smiles. They stood alongside administration and the Board of Directors to officially kick-off what will be the largest building project Northern Lebanon School District has seen in many years.

We are excited for the future and cannot wait to share more pictures and details as this building comes to life.



# NLHS Wrestler Aaron Seidel Shines on National Stage



The Northern Lebanon Wrestling program has a history of producing both team and individual championships. For the past decade, Coach Rusty Wallace and staff have had the Viking grapplers running on all cylinders. The Vikings have won nine straight section championships, won three District titles, and have seen success on the state level, reaching the state finals in 2017. The Vikings are looking ahead at a successful 2021-2022 campaign and will look to freshman Aaron Seidel to add some additional firepower to an already experienced squad. Seidel is a year-round wrestler who has been involved in the sport since he was 5 years old. He has seen success at every level, but like most youth wrestlers, the goal is to continue that success at the high school level. This past summer, Seidel did just that when he traveled to Fargo, ND in July to compete in the National Freestyle and Greco-Roman Championships. Freestyle and Greco-Roman are the styles of wrestling known around the world and seen in the Summer Olympics. Competing against the top wrestlers in the country, Seidel made his presence known. In the freestyle tournament, he went 7-2 racking up some victories over several nationally ranked wrestlers before falling one-win shy of the podium. In the Greco-Roman tournament, Seidel dropped his first match to Oregon, before winning 7 straight matches including a win over his first-round opponent to finish in 3rd place. Seidel was one of only three wrestlers in the event to lose a first-round match and win seven in a row to claim the bronze medal. Known as one of the toughest wrestling tournaments in

the country, Seidel opened some eyes and proved he could compete among the nation's best. The nationally-ranked freshman will take his offseason momentum into the season in hopes of helping the Vikings continue their run of dominance.

## NLHS FFA Works Together for Presentation at the Annual Lebanon Area Fair



Over the duration of late June and early July, the NL Chapter advisors and officers joined forces to present a booth on real meat vs fake meat for the annual Lebanon Area Fair.



## What's on the Menu? Third Grade Book Tasting







## Fredericksburg Elementary Second Graders Visit Gray's Apple Orchard!




## PATRIOT DAY
